Have your say

A series of events are taking place this month to ask people for their views on winter services. This will include discussions about salting routes, salt bins and how local community schemes operate. The next two events are on :

A fourth event is being arranged in Hedon – the date will be confirmed soon.

The workshop-style events will provide information and ask for residents' views. The council's winter services team, who deliver the services described by our policy for winter maintenance, will be there to discuss policy issues and describe the day-to-day running of operations.

Councillor Chris Matthews, cabinet portfolio holder for infrastructure, highways and emergency planning at the council, said : "This is a great opportunity for residents to be involved in our policy review and to find out how we can work together to ensure the service meets as many needs as possible."

At the earlier event on 8 October at Driffield School, several people asked what would happen if someone had an accident on a footway cleared by a resident. There is no law stopping a resident clearing snow and ice from the pavement outside their property or from pathways to their property or to public areas.

The Government has produced an easy-read guide showing what residents can and cannot do. Type "government snow code" into any search engine and the results will return the document.

All residents are invited to these events, but there are a limited number of spaces so booking is essential.

Helping the police

Humberside Police are continuing their efforts to reduce burglaries in the East Riding.

Detective sergeant Gavin Orsborne, from Humberside Police's serious acquisitive crime team, said : "I would like to invite members of the community to approach officers on patrols and report anything suspicious to them. If you see something suspicious then, chances are, it probably is.

"By doing this you are helping us to help you. The intelligence we get from local residents could provide us with key information which could lead to us catching these criminals.

"I also encourage any homeowners who have CCTV fitted to their properties to review their footage. There may be some evidence on your systems which could help our investigations."

You can also report any suspicious behaviour by calling Humberside Police on the non-emergency number 101, or if a burglary is in progress call 999 in an emergency.



Dog control orders

All town and parish councils in the East Riding are being consulted in the next few weeks about updates to the 2009 Dog Control Orders. Consultation will focus on the four orders to be retained, which :

- require owners to clean up after their dogs
- prohibit dogs from particular areas
- require dogs in particular areas to be kept on leads
- require a dog to be put on a lead if directed to do so by an officer.

The consultation will last for two months. Responses will be collated and reviewed, then added to the proposals before full public consultation. We need to include newly-created areas in the enclosed play areas list, and delete those that are no longer fenced-in or have been removed. Other areas such as beaches that are already prohibited, or proposed to be, also need to be considered and reviewed.

Councillor Jackie Cracknell, portfolio holder for community partnerships, said : "We are determined the orders will work well for us and want to bring the list of areas included in the orders up-to-date. We will be contacting all town and parish councils, providing them with a list of existing orders and the sites covered within their areas. We will include any proposed amendments and invite their comments."

New community pain management service

A new service has been launched across the East Riding to help people who have experienced moderate pain for over three months. The Humber Community Pain Service is available for includes a specialist physiotherapist, occupational therapist and a psychologist in pain management. They make assessments and deliver individual care management plans and group work programmes with the client.
