Bin collection service

East Riding residents will get a new fortnightly bin collection service of blue recycling bins and green landfill bins next year. This will enable them to recycle even more of their waste. The brown bin for composting is already emptied on alternate weeks.

The roll-out of the new collections follows the huge success of the trial. This led to a 30 per cent increase in the amount of waste being put in the blue recycling bins and a 35 per cent drop in the waste put in the green landfill bins. The recycling rate in the trial area rose to 70 per cent compared with a monthly recycling rate in the non-trial area of 60 per cent.

Councillor Symon Fraser, portfolio holder for environment, housing and planning, said: "The feedback from those residents taking part in the trial was first-rate. It is in response to our residents that we are now providing the same service across the area."

During the roll-out, which starts in March and will take 10 months to complete, residents will be supported by the council's recycling team going from door-to-door. There also will be a telephone hotline number, a dedicated email address and an information pack. The recycling team will also be giving presentations at community group meetings.

Ash dieback

A briefing note and Forestry Commission guide to identifying the symptoms is being circulated to all town and parish councils. The disease has been found at three local natural woodland sites: one north of Market Weighton and two in the Hornsea / Skipsea area. It is likely that the disease is present at many other sites. We can expect the disease to spread over the coming years.

Secure your property

Humberside Police is again reminding residents to leave their property secure.

Two recent incidents in one night resulted in the theft of four cars worth tens of thousands of pounds after their keys were taken from houses accessed by doors that were unlocked.

Humberside Police cannot stress enough the importance of leaving your properties secure, even if you are just leaving them for a few minutes.

These crimes may not have even been committed if the doors were locked. Not all of these crimes can be avoided, but some can.

Leaving houses and vehicles insecure is an invitation to criminals to come and take your property. Help the police to help you by being extra vigilant with your vehicles and homes.

Welton community-led plan

Welton residents met in 18 October at the Memorial Hall to express their views on their community. This open event was the first organised by the steering group, who are planning a series of consultation exercises to gather information and create a 'Welton Community-Led Plan'.



Some of our older residents tell us that they struggle to find tradespeople they feel they can trust. It is also possible that some tradespeople, in rural areas, may struggle in the face of rising fuel costs and householders monitoring their spending more closely.

We know parish councillors support residents and businesses in their local communities, and want to let you know about the Home Services Directory. It is operated jointly by the trading standards team and Age UK East Riding. The directory gives consumers confidence in the tradespeople they choose, as membership is only given to traders who satisfy these checks:

- police check
- register of County Court judgements
- trading standards complaints history.

East Riding rural strategy 2013 - 2016

The new strategy was launched at Bishop Burton College last month at an event attended by over 100 delegates. This gave participants the opportunity to sign up to themed workshops in January to develop the rural strategy action plan. These workshops are:

- Sustainable Rural Communities on Wednesday, 16 January 2013 at Skirlaugh Village Hall
- Rural Economy on Wednesday, 23 January 2013 at Hutton Cranswick Women's Institute Hall
- Rural Environment on Wednesday, 30 January 2013 at Holme upon Spalding Moor Village Hall.

The agenda and format for each workshop is being prepared, and will include discussion about:

- how partners' own activities and plans might contribute to the theme's action plan
- whether additional actions are needed to deliver the rural strategy objectives
- baseline data
- how the action plan is prioritised over the 2013-2016 timeframe.

Stay safe and warm

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is encouraging residents to help themselves to stay safe and warm this winter by preparing a winter plan before any bad weather. The council's new 'Make Time for Winter' booklet contains tips for staying safe and warm. It encourages residents to exchange telephone numbers with neighbours in case they are needed in an emergency to help with shopping, or just provide a friendly voice when it is cold and miserable.

It also includes a checklist to help create a winter plan, details of which roads are treated in winter, where to get important information about home improvement grants and even includes a tasty recipe for residents who may be running out of provisions. The booklet also gives guidance on how to clear snow and ice from the pavement outside homes or public spaces to prevent slips and falls.

The council stresses people should not be put off clearing paths because they are afraid of legal action.

Silent killer

Blue-light services and other agencies in the Humber have joined forces to remind people to have their fossil fuel and wood-burning appliances checked by a registered engineer before winter sets in.

Each year in England and Wales, carbon monoxide poisoning causes around 40 accidental deaths, over 200 serious injuries and 4,000 attendances at accident and emergency departments. The gas is produced when fossil fuel or wood burns without enough air. The gas is known as the 'silent killer' because it is colourless, tasteless and odourless.

Humberside Fire and Rescue Service has responded to 148 suspected carbon monoxide incidents since 2010. Twenty of these were confirmed as carbon monoxide leaks, and some sadly involved fatalities.

If anyone suspects that they are suffering from carbon monoxide poisoning, they should immediately turn off all appliances, go outside and seek medical help or call NHS Direct on 0845 46 47.
