Free talks about recycling

Waste and recycling officers were out and about in towns and villages during the recent national Recycle Week. They took their van and trailer to Bridlington, Beverley, Pocklington, Hedon and Hutton Cranswick to promote household recycling and chat with residents about reducing waste from the home.

If you are planning a community event, you can book one of the team up to a year in advance to give talks and presentations on topics including recycling activities, environmental issues, how waste is recycled and what into. Visits are free.

The team can speak about waste and recycling issues and answer questions, take requests for blue bins and kitchen caddies, and hand out information leaflets and recipe cards to help people make the most of their left-overs.

Beverley gears up for Elite cycle race

Following the success of the inaugural Tour de Yorkshire, the historic streets of Beverley will again reverberate to the sounds of cycling. On Friday, 24 July some of the country's top riders will take part in the hugely popular Elite Men's Circuit Race, sponsored by East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

The event will build on the spectacular success of the past ten years and is now regarded as one of the most popular and eagerly-anticipated town centre circuit races on the British Cycling calendar.

The Beverley event has a prize fund of £4,000 and is round six of eight counting towards a national series held over six weeks. The weekend attracts thousands of spectators and brings financial opportunities for the local economy, with Friday's main event covered by EuroSport TV.

There will be a number of road closures for the event, and some of Beverley town centre will be closed to motorists from as early as 6am. Signed diversions taking traffic around the town centre will be in place between 5-11pm.

Kennel Club award

The dog warden team's partnership with parish councils to promote responsible dog ownership was recognised recently at a national event in London, when they came second in the local authority category in the 2014 Kennel Club awards.

Dog fouling and dog control problems are two of the more frequent complaints received by town and parish councils. In 2013, a pilot scheme allowed town and parish councils to work alongside the dog wardens. Training was provided about gathering intelligence on dog control issues and the evidence needed for a warden to issue a fixed-penalty notice.

The scheme was rolled out in 2014 across the East Riding. Almost 190 councillors and clerks have taken part in the training, and a number of parishes are actively involved in managing issues in their own areas. Street light replacements

East Riding of Yorkshire Council successfully bid for £6 million from the Government to improve street lighting in the East Riding by 2018. The money is allowing street lighting columns to be replaced in towns and villages throughout the East Riding. You can see the programme of planned work, and which streets, by selecting a town / village from the drop-down menu on the website eastriding.gov.uk/street-light-replacement-programme

Every effort will be made to complete the works on time, but dates may change due to unforeseen circumstances. Once the new columns are erected it may take 3-4 weeks for the energy company to connect the power, and for the old column to be disconnected and removed.

As well as column replacement, the second year's programme of energy reduction has started. This will help us meet the Government's 2011 target of reducing energy use by 34% by 2020. This equates to over 4 million units of electricity. The council has already saved 2.9 million units by converting existing 'orange' low-pressure sodium lights to new 'white' light sources such as LED which use much less energy. Some local authorities have switched off lights to achieve their reductions.

Larger residential areas were targeted during the first programme. Some may be revisited during the second programme, followed by visits to smaller towns and villages throughout the next four years.

National Citizen Service

East Riding Voluntary Action Services is delivering the local National Citizen Service for 16 and 17 year-olds, with partners Tigers Trust and Hymers College.

The service is a nationally recognised programme to help young people with future education, training and employment applications, including university.

The package includes a summer programme which involves four weeks of activities for the young people taking place in late July and August.

Newland Bridge repairs

Major repair work will be carried out on this bridge on the A645 between Goole and Selby. The A645 will be closed to all traffic for the duration of the repairs in the interest of public safety.

The closure will start the week of Monday, 20 July 2015. It is planned to reopen this winter. Alternative routes for A645 traffic will be posted.
